#### 1. Introduction: The meaning of work

The meaning of work for individuals is changing and has the following characteristics:

1.6 Value-driven product development and service delivery focused on the human experience – "Am I using my strengths and capabilities?"; "Am I making a difference?"; "Do I add value?"
